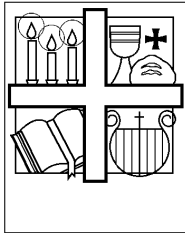

(This service uses the historic liturgy of the Lutheran Church.)

*(This service combines portions of the historic liturgy with some
suggestions from Creative Worship, a publication on worship
from the Lutheran-Church Missouri Synod.)*

During the seasons of Advent and Lent, Vesper Services, including the celebration of Holy Communion, are observed on Wednesday evenings at 7:00 p.m. These services are preceded by a light supper at 6:00 p.m. which is sponsored by the various boards and auxiliaries here at Grace.



About Holy Communion... *Our Doctrine & Practice*

It is out of genuine concern for the spiritual well-being of those who commune and for the integrity of the confession which is made at the altar that we respectfully ask all visitors to speak with the pastor before communing. Scripture teaches that Holy Communion is a sacred act, established by Christ Himself and given to His Church wherein the very body and blood of our Lord is given for the forgiveness of sin. This meal is also a testimony of the unity of our faith in all of its articles with all others who partake (I Corinthians 10:17). While it is our desire that all in attendance be able to participate in the fellowship of this sacred meal, we are clearly instructed on the basis of I Corinthians 11:28-29 and Romans 16:17-18 to recognize that there are differences regarding the doctrine and practice of this Sacrament. Hence, only those who have been confirmed in the teachings of the Lutheran Church - Missouri Synod are invited to commune.

For visitors who are from a church of a different confession and practice, we recognize that this communion practice may be a sensitive issue. If you have unanswered questions or if you desire to commune here at Grace, please speak with the pastor so as to arrange a time for discussion and instruction before participating in this Sacrament.

If you are a member in good standing of a sister congregation of the Lutheran Church - Missouri Synod, your presence is welcomed at the Table. If there is time before the service, please inform the pastor of your desire to commune so as to avoid any confusion at the Table. Otherwise, please make a point to do so after the service.
